A luxury chalet so embedded in nature it appears to have grown out of the ground with the dense, white forest that envelops it. At 66-degrees north in the Arctic Circle in Finnish Lapland, OCTOLA Private Wilderness is a solitary gem of man-made architecture amid 300 hectares of wilderness. Conceived by the team behind Luxury Action, which launched igloo accommodation in the Arctic last year, OCTOLA's magnetic natural environment invites guests to reignite the spirit and reconnect with nature. The chalet architecture nods to the traditional Lapp 'laavu' buildings of the native nomadic people, while the level of detail and comfort is a lesson in luxurious modern design. Every centimetre of OCTOLA was designed for the global traveller accustomed to five-star experiences, and its exclusive 10 rooms range from 22 to 48 square metres each. Modern yet comfortable designer furnishings invite cosy couch sessions, alone or with loved ones, with floor-to-ceiling windows removing any barrier to the serene snowy scenery beyond. Wilderness guides, a chef and a butler are all on hand to tend to guests' every wish, and the chalet can be partly or fully privatised, making it a must-experience for those seeking absolute solitude.
